# <u> Team 2 - Knowledge Organiser — Significant Author — Rudyard Kipling</u>





#### Key Knowledge: Kipling's life

- Rudyard Kipling was an author and poet.
- Rudyard Kipling was born in 1865 in Bombay, , during the time of the British Raj.
- He was sent back to boarding school in England at the age of 5.
- He enjoyed reading and listening to stories as a child and as an adult, he started writing stories for his children.
- He wrote the "Just So" stories, a group of fables, for his daughter who sadly died of pneumonia in 1899 (aged six).
- Rudyard Kipling wrote the *Just So* stories, *The Jungle Book* and the poem *If*.
- Rudyard Kipling spent a lot of time in Devon; he often visited
  Torquay and was educated for a time in Westward Ho! in North
  Devon.

#### DT knowledge

- Different **cam** shapes and positions create a different movement.
- A linear movement will move the follower up and down.
- A **rotary** movement will rotate the follower in a circular motion.
