




World Book Day

Internet Safety - Snapchat We have heard about a number of children using 'Snapchat' as a social media platform this week which has highlighted a number of concerns. Snapchat is a popular messaging app that lets users exchange pictures and videos. The terms of service in Snapchat state that users must be at least 13 years old. This is because users need to have a level of maturity to understand how the app can be abused by others and Snapchat also allows a newsfeed to be shared with users which may contain age inappropriate material. Although users think that the photos that are shared 'just disappear', young people really need to understand that the content they share can be saved and shared by others and may never go away.

If you decide to say yes to Snapchat in the future, please focus on the privacy settings. Sit down with your child and together go into the app's settings. Scroll down to "Who Can..." This is where you can control important safety features such as who can see your location and who can view your story. This is a perfect time to talk to your child about using their Snapchat account safely and responsibly. Discuss when and how often you'll check in on how they're using it and how they're feeling about it. Explain that you understand that social media is important to them, but, at the same time, your role is to protect them.
