## Number Bonds to 10



This week we will be learning about our number bonds to 10 . These are the numbers, that when combined together, make 10 . For example, 1 add 9 is 10 and 5 add 5 is 10 .
*You will need your tens frames from last time, but you can always draw another one - like this. *Next, find some lose items with two distinct parts such as shells/stones/pebbles.
*Then fill your tens frame with some of your items (for example, 6 cubes).
*Ask the question 'How many stones do I need to make 10?'
*Go over the number bond verbally - 6 stones and 4 stones make 10.

*6 and 4 makes 10
*If you want a challenge, you can record your number bond.
Extra challenge - Can you work out how many number bonds there are altogether?

Work in a pair and make bunny ears to total 10. You Might hold up 8 fingers so your child holds up 2.
